FUND AIM

The objective of the fund is to provide a combination of income and growth by tracking the performance of the FTSE EPRA Nareit Developed Dividend Plus Index (the "Index"). This objective is after the deduction of charges and taxation.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

The fund is in category 6 because it invests in property company shares and REITS. Company shares are sensitive to stock market variations; their value can change substantially over short time periods. REITS are sensitive to variations in value of underlying properties and rental income.







INDEX FUND MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Index Fund Management team comprises 25 fund managers, supported by two analysts. Management oversight is provided by the Global Head of Index Funds. CARBON RESERVES

Carbon reserves are fossil fuels (coal, oil and gas) which, if burnt, will become the carbon emissions of the future. To meet global climate change targets, the unabated use of fossil fuels is expected to decline over time.

The figure is a measure of the size of carbon reserves held by the fund's underlying companies.

CARBON EMISSIONS

Following the global Paris Agreement on climate change, companies in all sectors are expected to reduce their emissions to prepare and adapt for a low-carbon economy.

Carbon emissions intensity describes the relationship between the carbon emissions of a company and its salesⁱⁱ.

ⁱ Carbon dioxide equivalent (CO₂e) is a standard unit to compare the emissions of different greenhouse gases.

ⁱⁱ The choice of this metric follows best practice recommendations from the **Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures**.

KEY RISKS

- Most of the fund holds investments from a particular market sector, that of property company shares and REITs. Funds like this can be more volatile than funds that invest across many market sectors.
